What is Bullying?

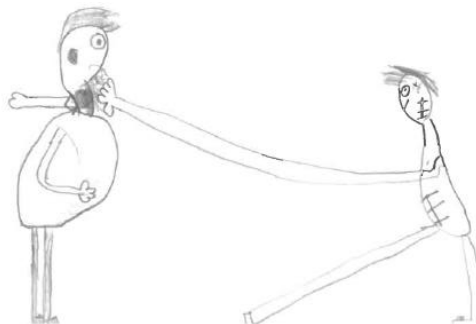
In our school, bullying is hurting someone more than once, on purpose, by using behaviour or words which are meant to frighten or hurt that person.

Bullying can be

Emotional: Hurting people's feelings, leaving you out.



Physical: Punching, kicking, spitting, hitting or pushing.



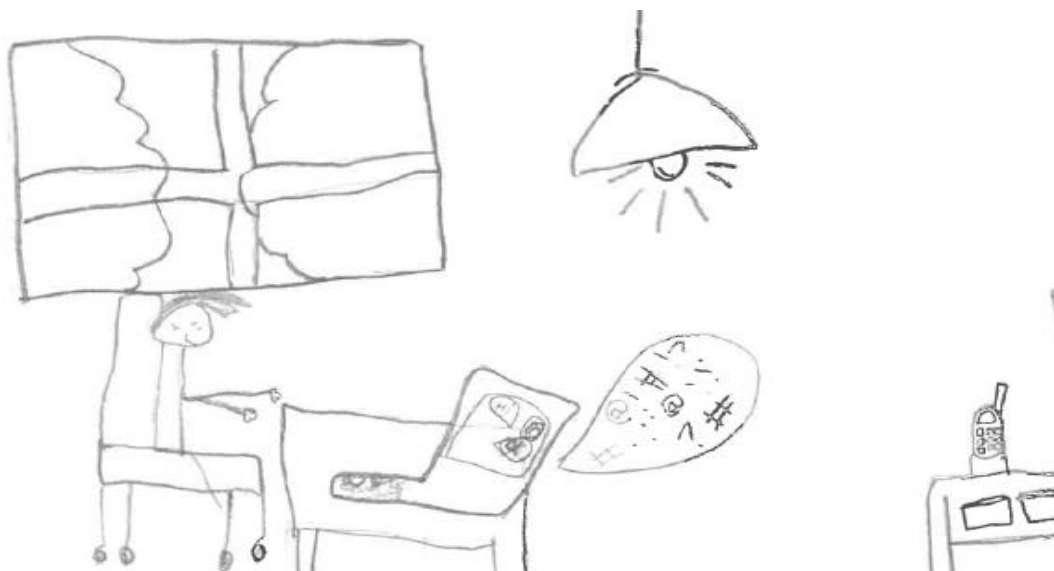
Verbal: Being teased, name calling.



Written: Letters, notes, graffiti.



Cyber: Saying unkind things by text, e-mail and on the internet.



Bullying is NOT

- When friends fall out or argue
- Fighting
- Accidents

If you are being bullied do:



Don't:

- Do what they say.
- Get angry or look upset
 - Hit them.
- Think it's your fault.
- Keep it to yourself

What should I do if I see someone else is being bullied?

- Don't walk away and ignore the bullying.
- Ask the person to stop if it is safe to do so.
- Don't stay silent or the bullying will keep happening.

Who can I tell?

- Tell a friend who will help by going to an adult with you.
- A peer mediator
- Any adult at school
- A family member
- Any other trusted adult.
